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## TIPS FOR SUCCESS

1. PATTERN: This kit includes a printed version of your pattern be sure to read through your entire pattern before you begin cutting your fabrics! In some cases, a digital version of your pattern may be available for download in your pattern library. Simply log in to your Craftsy account to access it. If for any reason a newer version of your pattern becomes available, we'll send you an email with instructions about how to access it.
2. BLADE: Is your rotary blade sharp and ready? A sharp blade will require you to use less energy when cutting! If you see small threads still intact when you cut through your fabric, that's a good indication it's time to change your blade.
3. MACHINE: Prepare for sewing success by ensuring that your sewing machine needle is sharp. Are you experiencing breakage of your top thread, or skipped stitches? Do you hear a quiet popping sound when your needles move through the fabric? These are all signs that your needle is dull and it's time for a change.

- 50wt cotton thread


## General Guidelines

Please read the entire pattern once through before starting. Use a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance unless otherwise directed. Blocks finish at $16^{\prime \prime}$.

## Abbreviations

- WOF = Width Of Fabric (approx. 42")
- HST = Half-Square Triangle

## PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

## Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:
(3) $27 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, into:
(40) $27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares (Flying Geese Units)
(3) $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, into:
(40) $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares (HST Units)
(5) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, into:
(40) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles (Star Blocks)
(2) $61 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, into:
(10) $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares (Courthouse Steps Blocks)

From Fabric B, cut:
(3) $27 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, into:
(40) $27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares (Flying Geese Units)
(2) $4 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, into:
(10) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares (Star Blocks)
(6) $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, into:
(80) $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares (Courthouse Steps Blocks)
(8) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips (Binding)

From the Background Fabric, cut:
(3) $5 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strip, into:
(20) $5 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ squares (Flying Geese Units)
(8) $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, into:
(120) $212^{\prime \prime}$ squares (Star Blocks)
(5) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, into:
(40) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares (Star Blocks)
(25) $3^{\prime \prime} \times$ WOF strips, into:
(40) $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares (Half-Square Triangle Units)
(40) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 11 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ rectangles
(Courthouse Steps Blocks)
(40) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles (Courthouse Steps Blocks)

## Flying Geese Assembly STEP 1

To make the Flying Geese units, gather:
(1) $5 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime} \times 5 \frac{1}{4} 4^{\prime \prime}$ square of Background fabric
(4) $27 / 8^{\prime \prime} \times 27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares of Fabric $A$.

## STEP 2

On the wrong side of the $27 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ squares of Fabric A, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Place two drawn squares, right sides together on the corners of a $51 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ square of Background fabric as shown. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ on both sides of the line.


## STEP 3

Cut on the line and press out.


## STEP 4

Place a drawn square on a corner of the piece as shown. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from both sides of the line.


## STEP 5

Cut on the line and press out. Repeat to make a total of 40 Fabric A/Background fabric flying geese units measuring $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.

## STEP 6

Repeat to make a total of 40 Fabric B/Background fabric Flying Geese units.

## Half-Square Triangle Assembly

## STEP 1

On the backs of the $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares of Background fabric, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. Place a drawn square, right sides together on a $3^{\prime \prime}$ square of Fabric $A$. Sew $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ from both sides of the line.


## STEP 2

Cut apart on line, open and press towards Fabric A. Square to $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.


## STEP 3

Make a total of 80 Fabric A/Background fabric HST units.

## Star Block: Side Unit Assembly

To make a Star Block Side Unit, gather:
(1) Fabric A/Background fabric Flying Geese Unit
(1) $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime} \times 4 \frac{1}{2^{\prime \prime}}$ rectangle of Fabric A
(2) Fabric A/Background fabric HST Units
(2) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of Background fabric

## STEP 1

Sew a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square of Background fabric to both sides of the Flying Geese unit. Press in the direction of the arrows. Repeat to make four.

## STEP 2

Sew a Fabric A/Background fabric HST unit to both sides of a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle of Fabric $A$ as shown in the diagram. Press in the direction of the arrows. Repeat to make four.

## STEP 3

Sew the two units together as shown. The Star Block Side Unit should measure $41 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. Repeat to make four.

## PATTERN INSTRUCTIONS

## Star Block: Center Unit Assembly

To make a Star Block Center Unit, gather:
(1) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square of Fabric B
(4) Flying Geese Units of the Fabric B/Background fabric
(4) $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of Background fabric

## STEP 1

Arrange the pieces as shown in the diagram. Sew the pieces in each row and sew the rows together. Press in the direction of the arrows. The Center Star Block should measure $81 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square.


## Full Star Block Assembly

To make the Star Block, gather:
(4) Side Star Block Units
(1) Center Star Block Unit
(4) $41 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares of Background fabric

## STEP 1

Lay out the pieces as shown in the diagram. Sew the pieces in each row and sew the rows together. Press in the direction of the arrows. The Star Block should measure $161 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square. Repeat to make 10 Star Blocks total.


## Courthouse Steps Block Assembly

To make a Courthouse Steps Block, gather:
(8) $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares of Fabric B
(1) $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square of Fabric $A$
(4) $3 \times 6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles of Background fabric
(4) $3 \times 11 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ " rectangles of Background fabric

## STEP 1

Lay out (4) $3^{\prime \prime}$ squares of Fabric $B$, (4) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 6 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles of Background fabric and one $61 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ square of Fabric $A$, as shown. Sew the pieces together in rows and the rows together. Press in the direction of the arrows.


## STEP 2

Sew (2) $3^{\prime \prime} \times 3^{\prime \prime}$ squares of Fabric B to both ends of a $3^{\prime \prime} \times 11 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ rectangle of Background fabric. Press in the direction of the arrows. Repeat to make two units.


Make 2

## STEP 3

Sew a $3^{\prime \prime} \times 111 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangle of Background fabric to both sides of the unit from Step 1. Press in the direction of the arrows.

## STEP 4

Sew a unit from Step 2 to the top and bottom. Press in the direction of the arrows. Repeat to make a total of 10 Courthouse Steps Blocks measuring 16½" square.

## Quilt Top Assembly

## STEP 1

Layout the blocks in 5 rows with 4 blocks each, alternating Star Blocks and Courthouse Steps Blocks as shown in the diagram on the next page. Sew the blocks into rows, then sew the rows together. Press in the direction of the arrows.

## Finishing The Quilt

## STEP 1

Baste, layer, and quilt as desired.

## STEP 2

Sew the Binding strips together end to end, using a mitered seam. Bind as desired.
